

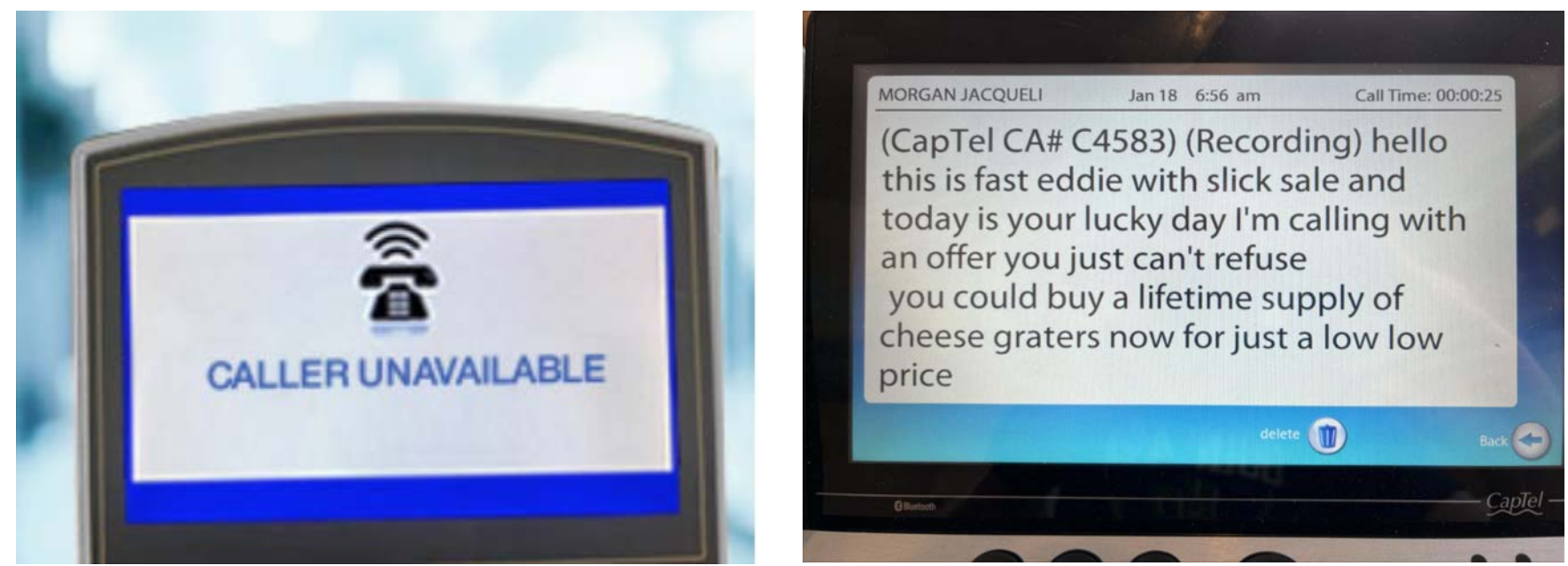


Screen Unwanted Calls with CapTel's Answering Machine

Unwanted calls? CapTel's built-in Answering Machine lets you screen callers before you answer by playing incoming messages aloud for you to hear and read captions while the caller leaves a message. If the captions show it is a call you want to take, simply pick up the CapTel handset to talk to your caller. If it is a call from someone you don't want to talk to, let them finish leaving their message on the Answering Machine. You can always read their message later and call them back if interested.

Make sure the Answering Machine is turned on, and the CapTel menu is set to Play Messages Aloud/External Speaker Turned On.

Note: If you use this tactic often to screen calls, you may want to set a low ring count in the Answering Machine settings so that the call is "picked up" earlier.



CapTel 840i  
If you don't recognize the Caller ID, it may be a spam call.

CapTel 2400i  
Use the answering machine to screen calls.

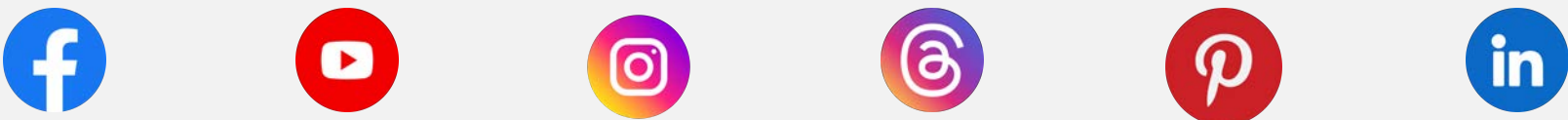

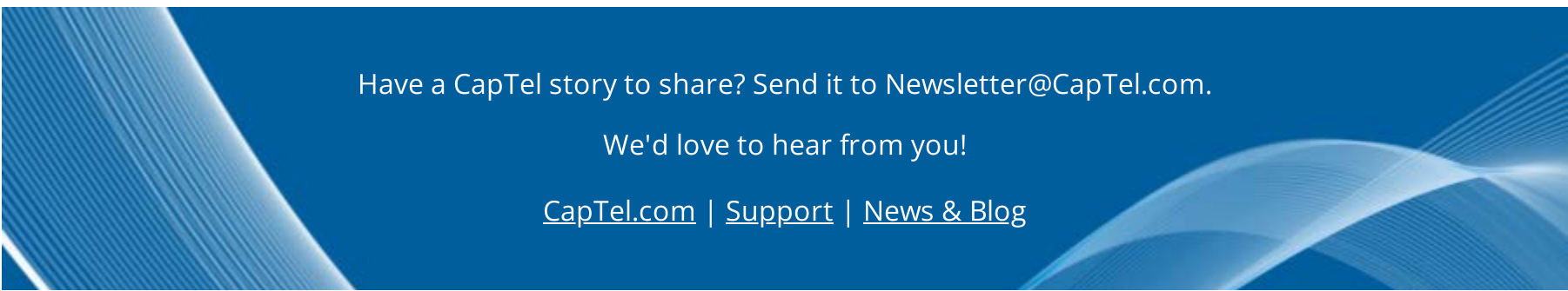
