


# Helpful Tips for Using Your CapTel Phone

### Getting Your Messages Remotely Check your CapTel answering machine from anywhere!

Even when you are away from your home or office, you can check messages left on your CapTel answering machine using the Remote Access feature. With Remote Access, you call into your CapTel phone number and enter a personal ID number (PIN). Your CapTel phone



confirms your PIN, then plays your answering messages aloud for you to listen to. You can replay messages, skip to the next message, or delete messages all from your remote location.

Before you can use this feature, you must turn "Remote Access" on in your CapTel menu settings, then pick a personal 4-digit PIN number to use for security. Be sure to jot the PIN number down to help you remember it!

# **Tip**:

If possible, when calling in to retrieve your messages, use a different CapTel phone in order to be able to see captions of the messages. If you call using any other phone, you will be able to listen to the voice part of the answering machine messages but you will not be able to read captions at your remote location.

There is a cost for each minute of captions generated, paid from a federally administered fund. No cost is passed on to the CapTel user for using the service.
