




Erasing Old Answering Machine Messages


While it’s helpful to review message details at a later date, if your CapTel answering machine memory fills up, your phone won’t be able to save new messages until some of the older ones are erased to free space in memory. You can review answering machine messages one at a time to delete them as you go, or you can erase all answering machine messages at once.

Clearing answering machine messages

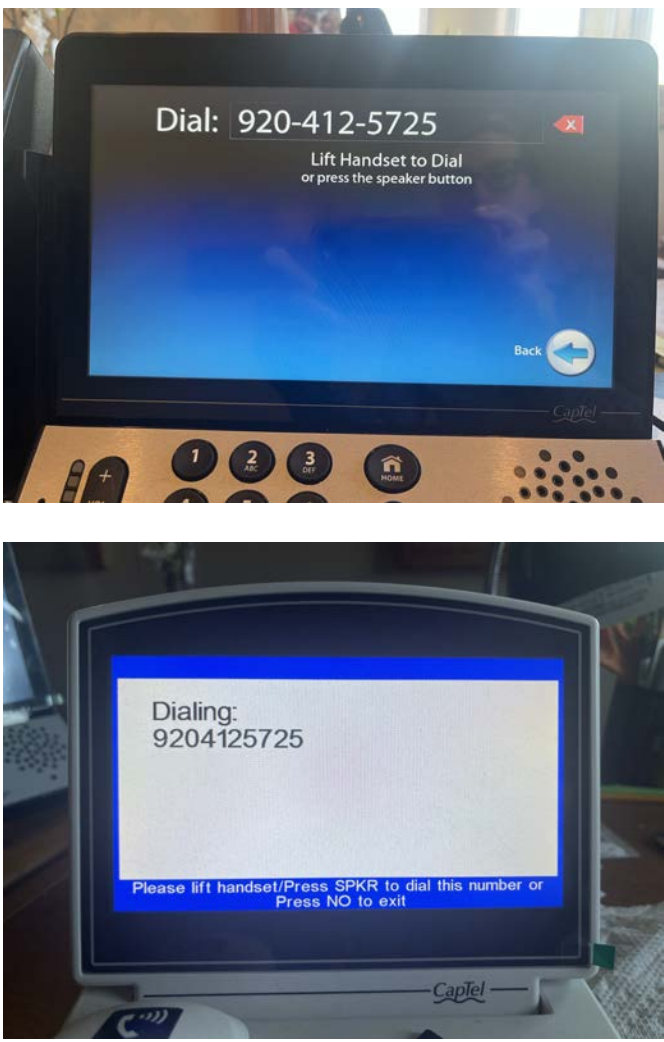


Extra Time to Dial

If you need a little extra time to dial a phone number, try this handy tip:

- 1. Leave your CapTel handset down (hung up) and start dialing by pressing the phone numbers buttons on the dial keypad. As you type, you can see the phone number on the CapTel display.
- 2. If you make a mistake, you can erase by pressing the DOWN button on the CapTel 840/840i/880i or by touching the Backspace (X) on the CapTel 2400i screen.
- 3. When you are ready to place your call, pick up the CapTel handset. CapTel will automatically dial the phone number you entered.
